Why Talk About EPR?

In most parts of the country, local governments and their residents bear the financial and operational responsibility for the recycling and disposal of printed paper and packaging. EPR policies aim to shift the financial responsibility of managing a material throughout its entire lifecycle, from the design phase to production to disposal, to the brands that produce the material.

The fees collected by smart, well-designed EPR programs provide a sustainable funding source for residential recycling infrastructure, education, and operations while concurrently driving packaging innovations and strong environmental outcomes, including waste minimization and increased recyclability, that are key for a circular economy. As part of our commitment to help align state policies and ensure that new EPR policies are well designed and reflect global best practices, The Recycling Partnership's Policy Accelerator put together this state toolkit of resources.
